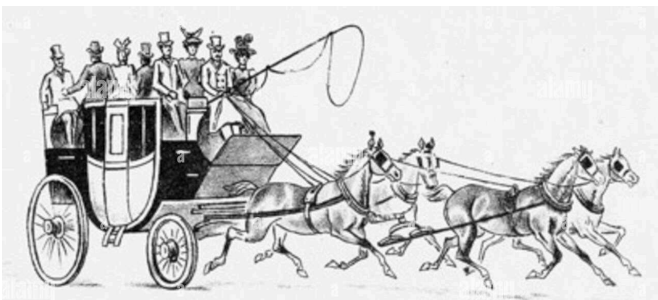
Parish Council

We are now getting six buses a day which, apart from the early (0740) one to King's Lynn, run every two hours from 0925 until 17.25. There are now also five a day to Hunstanton (and another if you only want to go to Sedgeford), again at regular intervals. It now sounds like a proper bus service, unlike its predecessor. Note that the former 0930 bus (the threshold time for using a concessionary bus pass) has been shifted to 0925. However it seems that there is an exception to the 9.30 rule for some 'country buses, of which ours is one.

A Letter from Ukraine

Good evening Paul, Val and Sarah and all my friends at Flitcham. I miss you very much, Flitcham, I want to run down the street again in the morning 😊, I also want to play Bingo. Everything is fine with us, neither good nor bad. For the past two weeks I have been moving from one apartment to another, a lot of things, every day before work I have to take things by taxi and trolleybus. It is very troublesome, a lot of things, but everything seems necessary, it is difficult that I do not have my own housing and have to drag it all with me.

I expect soon that soon my parents will finally leave the occupation. Dad is very worried, it is difficult for him to throw away everything that he has acquired in his entire life. Mom is more determined, she also feels sorry to throw away everything – the house, the apartment, the animals (this is probably the most painful), but she understands that there will be no life there – no communication, there are almost no normal people, explosions, drones. They didn't tell me not to worry, but my brother told me that about a month ago, when they were driving in a car to find a connection somewhere, to call us, a drone flew into their car, they miraculously survived, the car was very shaken, the doors flew off, dad barely pulled the car on one wheel, without tires. When I found out about it, I cried all night. Now I'm waiting for them to finally come to us.

And in general, I'm not in a very good mood, because I live in constant stress. I dream of coming to England some day, at least for a few days in the summer, to see all my dear English people. But, if I go, I will definitely adjust to the day when there will be Bingo❤️. I am very grateful for your letters, send greetings to your entire wonderful family and all people of Flitcham.
