Changes to Telephone Network

The network which delivers the current landline phone services is to be switched off at the end of 2025, after which all landline services will be offered digitally, using broadband connections rather than copper phone lines. These changes will affect everyone who has a landline which they would like to keep on using. BT is now moving fixed broadband customers to its Digital Voice service in a region-by-region roll out and East Anglia is scheduled for this Spring. BT is focussing on customers who are most ready to switch, so vulnerable customers (including those with a healthcare pendant), landline-only customers and those in areas with no mobile reception won't be switched for now. You will be contacted four weeks before any proposed changes, so there shouldn't be any surprises.

In most cases, the changeover will be simple; while some phones may require an adaptor, many will continue working (particularly cordless phones) – you'll just have to plug yours into your router or a new socket. Once set up, your phone will work in much the same way as it always has. You'll be able to keep the same phone number and will still hear a dial tone when you lift the handset. You'll also still have to pay for calls in the same way – even if they're delivered using your broadband connection.

If you don't have, or want, broadband but only have a landline, you won't be forced to pay for broadband services. Your digital phone service will work using a special dedicated broadband connection and should not cost any more than you pay now. In any event, if you don't yet want to change to a digital service, traditional phone services will continue to work for a couple of years.

Note: Although this article refers to BT, other providers that use BT's network (operated by Open Reach), and which will almost certainly include yours, must follow the same procedure and contact their customers well in advance of the changes.
